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Management Discussion of Fund Performance

June 5, 2024

This Management Discussion of Fund Performance presents the views of Counsel Portfolio Services Inc. (“Counsel” or “we”) on the significant factors and developments during the year ended March 31, 2024 that have affected the Fund’s performance and outlook. For information on the Fund’s longer-term performance, please refer to the *Past Performance* section of the report.

In addition, net asset value (NAV) refers to the value of the Fund or a series, as calculated for transaction purposes, on which the discussion of Fund performance is based.

Investment Objective and Strategies

The Fund seeks to achieve a high level of current income with the potential for capital appreciation. The Fund invests, either directly or through other investment funds, primarily in fixed-income securities and preferred shares issued around the world. The Fund also uses forward currency contracts to gain desired exposures to a variety of foreign currencies.

Risks

The risks of investing in the Fund remains as discussed in the Fund’s initial Simplified Prospectus. The Fund is suitable for investors who: seek global fixed income investments to hold as part of their portfolio; want a medium to long-term investment; can handle the volatility of bond markets; and have a low to medium tolerance for risk. The Fund is only available on a prospectus-exempt basis.

Results of Operations

Investment Performance

The performance of the Fund’s Series Private Wealth securities is discussed below. The performance of all other series offered by the Fund is shown in the *Past Performance* section of this report. Where series returns differ, it is primarily because different levels of fees and expenses were charged to each series, or because securities of a series were not issued and outstanding for the entire reporting period. Please refer to the *Series Information* section of this report for the varying management and administration fees payable by series.

During the year, the Fund’s Series Private Wealth securities returned 2.72% (after deducting fees and expenses). This compares with a –0.85% return of the FTSE WGBI Index. All index and series returns are calculated on a total return basis in Canadian dollar terms. Investors cannot invest in an index without incurring fees, expenses and commissions, none of which are reflected in the index returns.

The U.S. Federal Reserve, the European Central Bank and the Bank of England raised interest rates early in the period in response to elevated inflation. After July 2023, the Federal Reserve kept the federal funds rate at a target range of 5.25%–5.50%. Treasury yields reached peak levels and then fell in response to the policy shift. The Bank of Japan raised its policy rate for the first time in 17 years, with an increase to 0%, but many central banks signalled potential rate cuts for 2024.

The Fund outperformed the indices primarily due to sovereign yield curve exposure, including duration exposures in emerging markets in Asia, Brazil, Colombia, Hungary, Indonesia, and South Korea. Currency positions, mainly in Asian markets such as the Malaysian Ringgit and South Korean Won, detracted during the period. The Fund maintained a defensive approach regarding interest rates in developed markets, while holding long currency exposures in select emerging markets.

Net Assets

The Fund’s NAV increased by \$8.8 million, or 24.4%, to \$44.8 million as at March 31, 2024, from \$36.0 million as at March 31, 2023. Of this increase, \$7.8 million was attributable to net sales and \$1.0 million to investment performance (after deducting fees and expenses).

Fees and Expenses

The annualized management expense ratio (“MER”) for each series during the year ended March 31, 2024, was generally similar to the MER for the year ended March 31, 2023. Total expenses paid vary from period to period mainly as a result of changes in average assets in each series. Please note that no management fees are charged to the Fund; see the *Series Information* section of this report for further details. The MERs for all series (before and after waivers or absorptions, if any) are presented in the *Financial Highlights* section of this report.

Recent Developments

The sub-advisor notes inflation rates are mostly off their pandemic peaks, but only a few countries have inflation back in target range. Policymakers are now determining when inflation will fall back sustainably into target ranges, while being aware of the reemergence of various inflation risks. Broadly the global inflation cycle has peaked; however, some countries remain more vulnerable to inflation dynamics and weaker fundamentals limit their ability to participate in the global easing cycle. Structurally, several factors remain top of mind, including the United States’ twin fiscal and current account deficits, which are a concern for the U.S. Dollar. Global splits and shifting alliances have led to structural changes in global supply chains, which are expected to endure and strengthen over the medium term. Geopolitics has become an ever-present shadow over financial markets and economies, with risks to markets from geopolitical developments remaining uncertain. The sub-advisor continues to monitor individual inflation drivers and outcomes, as well as policy responses, in different regions and countries.

On November 30, 2023 (the “Transaction Date”), The Canada Life Assurance Company acquired Investment Planning Counsel Inc. (the parent company of Counsel). Counsel continues to operate as manager of the Fund. Effective on the Transaction Date, changes to the membership of the Fund’s Independent Review Committee and Counsel’s Board of Directors were made to align governance structures with Counsel’s affiliated entity Canada Life Investment Management Ltd.

Related Party Transactions

Management and Administration Services

For Series Private Wealth, the Fund paid administration fees to Counsel at the annual rates specified under *Series Information* in this report and as more fully described in the Simplified Prospectus. In return for the administration fees, Counsel pays all costs and expenses (other than certain specified fund costs) required to operate the Fund. No management fees are paid by the Fund.

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Other Related Party Transactions

Other investment funds managed by Counsel (“Top Funds”) invest in Series O securities offered by the Fund on a prospectus-exempt basis in accordance with the investment objectives of those funds. Series Private Wealth securities are issued on a prospectus-exempt basis to investors in discretionary managed account programs offered by IPC Securities Corporation, an affiliate of Counsel. As a result of these investments, the Fund is subject to large transaction risk as discussed in the Counsel Funds’ Simplified Prospectus. Counsel manages this risk to reduce the possibility of any adverse effect on the Fund or on its investors, through such processes as requiring advance notice of large redemptions. At March 31, 2024, Top Funds owned 40.8% of the Fund’s NAV and Series Private Wealth investors owned 59.2% of the Fund’s NAV. As of March 31, 2024, Counsel had not received notice of any large redemptions. All related party transactions are based on the NAV per security on each transaction day.

During the year, the Fund did not rely on an approval, positive recommendation, or standing instruction from the Counsel Funds’ Independent Review Committee (“IRC”) with respect to any related party transactions.

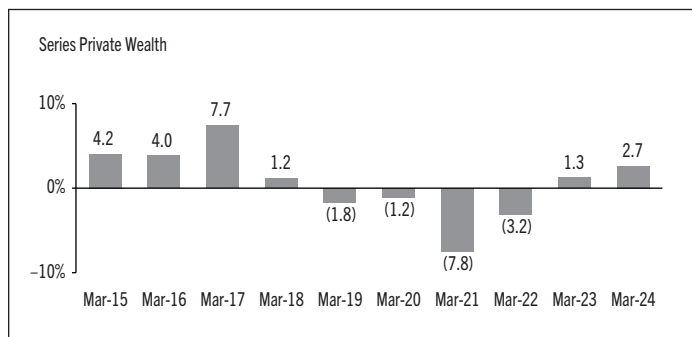
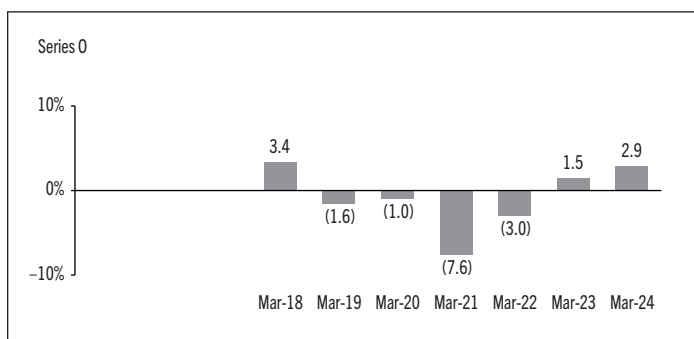
Past Performance

The indicated rates of return are the historical annual compound total returns, including changes in NAV per security and assuming reinvestment of all distributions. They do not take into account sales, redemption, distribution or optional sales charges, management fees directly payable by investors or income taxes payable by any investor that would have reduced returns. (3) The trading expense ratio ("TER") represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs incurred as an annualized percentage of the daily average NAV during the period. Where the Fund invests in securities of an Underlying Fund, the TERs presented for the Fund include the portion of TERs of its Underlying Fund(s) attributable to this investment.

(4) The portfolio turnover rate ("PTR") indicates how actively the portfolio advisor manages the investments. A PTR of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the period. The higher PTR in a period, the greater the trading costs payable by the Fund in the period, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the period. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high PTR and the performance of the Fund. Costs incurred to realign the Fund's portfolio after a fund merger, if any, are excluded from the PTR.
