Management Discussion of Fund Performance

November 8, 2024

This Management Discussion of Fund Performance presents the portfolio management team's view on the significant factors and developments that have affected the performance and outlook of Counsel Canadian Growth (the "Fund") in the six-month period ended September 30, 2024 (the "period"). If the Fund was established during the period, "period" represents the period since inception.

During the period, "Manager" refers to Counsel Portfolio Services Inc. ("Counsel"), which is a subsidiary of The Canada Life Assurance Company ("Canada Life"). On October 1, 2024, Counsel was amalgamated with Canada Life Investment Management Ltd. ("CLIML"), whereupon the amalgamated company, named CLIML, continued as the Fund's Manager. The Manager has entered into a fund administration agreement with Mackenzie Financial Corporation ("Mackenzie"), an affiliate of the Manager and Canada Life, for administrative services. In addition, net asset value ("NAV") refers to the value of the Fund as calculated for transaction purposes, on which the discussion of Fund performance is based.

Results of Operations

Investment Performance

The performance of all series in the current and previous periods is shown in the *Past Performance* section of the report. Performance will vary by series primarily because fees and expenses differ between series, or because securities of a series were not issued and outstanding for the entire reporting period. Please refer to the *Series Information* section of this report for the varying management and administration fees payable by each series. The following comparison to market indices is intended to help investors understand the Fund's performance relative to the general performance of the markets. However, the Fund's mandate may be different from that of the indices shown.

During the period, the Fund's Series A securities returned 9.3% (after deducting fees and expenses paid by the series). This compares with a return of 10.0% for the Fund's broad-based index, the S&P/TSX Composite Index, and a return of 4.9% for the Fund's narrow index, the MSCI Canada Growth Index. All index and series returns are calculated on a total return basis in Canadian dollar terms. Investors cannot invest in an index without incurring fees, expenses and commissions, which are not reflected in the index returns.

Canadian equities rose over the period despite volatility, with the financials sector and mining stocks leading market performance. The Bank of Canada signalled easing inflation by cutting its policy rate in June 2024 – it was the first among G7 central banks to begin doing so – and again in July and September. The central bank's more accommodative policy stance came as the Canadian economy was less robust than the U.S. economy and as Canadian homeowners faced higher debt burdens.

Within the MSCI Canada Growth Index, financials, materials and consumer discretionary were the best-performing sectors, while utilities, energy and industrials were the weakest.

The Fund underperformed the broad-based index because of its focus on growth stocks, which underperformed the broader Canadian market in the period. Given the Fund's mandate, the return of the narrow index is a more meaningful comparison.

The Fund outperformed the narrow index, with overweight exposure to the financials and materials sectors contributing to performance. Holdings in the United States also contributed to performance. Overweight exposure to the energy sector detracted from performance.

Over the period, neither portfolio activity nor market developments significantly changed the positioning of the Fund.

Net Assets

The Fund's net assets increased by 28.9% during the period to \$157.4 million. This change was composed primarily of \$13.4 million in net income (including any interest and/or dividend income) from investment performance, after deducting fees and expenses, and an increase of \$21.9 million due to net securityholder activity (including sales, redemptions and cash distributions). The securityholder activity includes an inflow of \$24.0 million on September 4, 2024, due to a transaction by Top Funds (as described further under *Other Related Party Transactions*).

Fees and Expenses

The annualized management expense ratio ("MER") for each series during the period ended September 30, 2024, was generally similar to the MER for the year ended March 31, 2024. Total expenses paid vary from period to period mainly as a result of changes in average assets in each series. The MERs for all series are presented in the *Financial Highlights* section of this report.

Recent Developments

The sub-advisor, Picton Mahoney Asset Management, believes that the U.S. Federal Reserve's decision to lower the federal funds rate by half a percentage point in September will contribute to inflation, given structural issues in housing and commodities. Without changing the Fund's strategic positioning, the sub-advisor has taken the opportunity at the margin to increase exposure to companies it believes will perform well during a period of economic expansion.

Effective October 1, 2024, the manager, trustee, portfolio manager and promoter of the Fund, Counsel, amalgamated with CLIML, whereupon the amalgamated company, named CLIML, continued to serve as the manager, trustee, portfolio manager and promoter of the Fund.

Related Party Transactions

Management Fees

The management fee for each applicable series is calculated and accrued daily as a percentage of its NAV. The Fund's management fees were used by the Manager to pay for: costs of managing the investment portfolio; providing investment analysis and recommendations; making investment decisions; the purchase and sale of the investment portfolio; and providing other services. The Manager also used the management fees to fund trailing commissions and other compensation (collectively, "distribution-related payments") paid to registered dealers and brokers whose clients invest in the Fund.

The following dealers affiliated with the Manager may be entitled to distribution-related payments from the Manager on the same basis as unrelated registered brokers and dealers: IPC Securities Corporation, Investors Group Securities Inc., IPC Investment Corporation, Investors Group Financial Services Inc., and Quadrus Investment Services Ltd.

The Manager used approximately 41% of the total management fee revenues received from all Counsel funds to fund distribution-related payments to registered dealers and brokers. In comparison, such distribution-related payments for the Fund represented 44% of the management fees paid. This amount is an average percentage of the management fees paid by all series. The actual percentage for each series may be higher or lower than the average depending on the level of trailing commissions paid for that series.

Management and Administration Services

For each applicable series, the Fund paid management fees and administration fees to the Manager at the annual rates specified under *Series Information* in this report and as more fully described in the Simplified Prospectus. In return for the administration fees, the Manager pays all costs and expenses (other than certain specified fund costs) required to operate the Fund that are not included in the management fees. See also *Management Fees*.

Other Related Party Transactions

Other investment funds managed by the Manager (“Top Funds”) invest in Series O securities offered by the Fund on a prospectus-exempt basis in accordance with the investment objectives of those funds. Series Private Wealth securities are issued on a prospectus-exempt basis to investors in discretionary managed account programs offered by IPC Securities Corporation, an affiliate of the Manager. As a result of these investments, the Fund is subject to large transaction risk as discussed in its Simplified Prospectus. The Manager manages this risk to reduce the possibility of any adverse effect on the Fund or on its investors, through such processes as requiring advance notice of large redemptions. At September 30, 2024, Top Funds owned 67.9% of the Fund’s NAV, and Series Private Wealth investors owned 20.6% of the Fund’s NAV. As of September 30, 2024, the Manager was preparing for a significant redemption by Top Funds in Series O on November 7, 2024. All related party transactions are based on the NAV per security on each transaction day.

The Fund did not rely on an approval, positive recommendation or standing instruction from the Counsel Funds’ Independent Review Committee with respect to any related party transactions in the period.

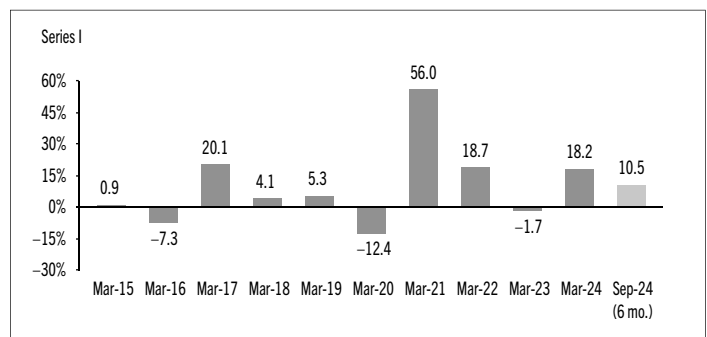
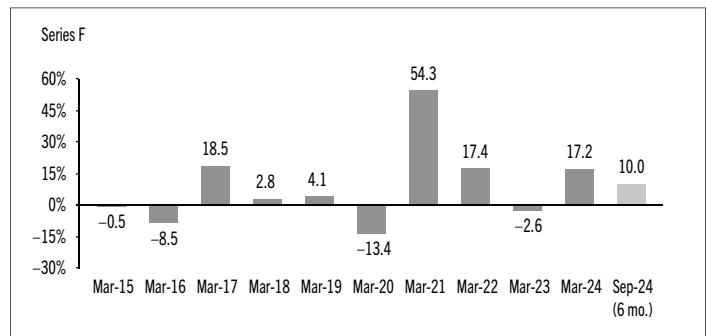
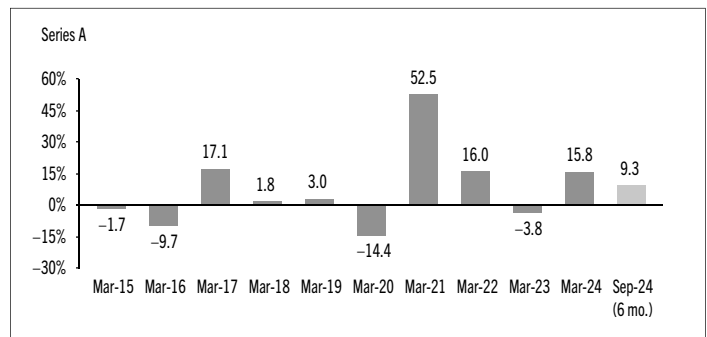
Past Performance

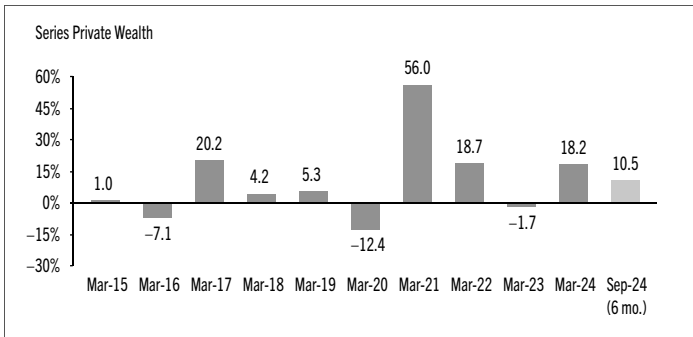
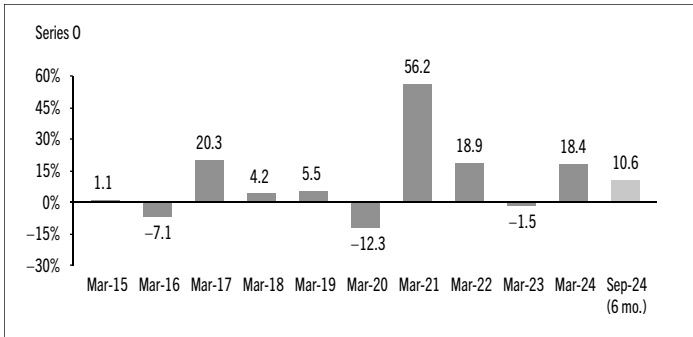
Year-by-Year Returns

Where the Fund directly invests in securities of another fund (including exchange-traded funds or "ETFs"), the MERs presented for the Fund include the portion of MERs of the other fund(s) attributable to this investment. Any income distributions received from ETFs managed by affiliates of the Manager, with the intention of offsetting fees paid within those ETFs but which are not considered to be duplicative fees under regulatory requirements, are treated as waived expenses for MER purposes. The Manager may waive or absorb operating expenses at its discretion and stop waiving or absorbing such expenses at any time without notice.
- (3) The trading expense ratio ("TER") represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs incurred as an annualized percentage of daily average net assets during the period. Where the Fund invests in securities of another fund (including ETFs), the TERs presented for the Fund include the portion of TERs of the other fund(s) attributable to this investment.
- (4) The Fund's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the Fund's portfolio advisor manages its portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the period. The higher the Fund's portfolio turnover rate in a period, the greater the trading costs payable by the Fund in the period, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of a fund. The portfolio turnover rate is not provided when the Fund is less than one year old. The value of any trades to realign the Fund's portfolio after a fund merger, if any, is excluded from the portfolio turnover rate.
